

EPA, Army Corps of Engineers reach agreement on new WOTUS rule State leaders applaud 'common sense' definition of jurisdictional waters

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers reached agreement Jan. 23 on a "common sense" definition of navigable waters that frees farmers, ranchers and other landowners from confusing and burdensome regulations.

Mary Walker, administrator of EPA's Southeast Region, called the new Navigable Waters Protection Rule "a clear, appropriate and legally defensible definition of waters of the United States."

The updated definition describes four categories of jurisdictional waters and makes clear exclusions for water features that have not been regulated traditionally. It also defines terms in the law that have not been defined before, Walker said.

The new rule defines federally regulated waters as:

- Territorial seas and traditional navigable waters,
- Perennial and intermittent tributaries to those waters,
- Certain lakes, ponds and impoundments, and
- Wetlands adjacent to jurisdictional waters.

Specifically excluded from that definition are features that only contain water in direct response to rain, most roadside and farm ditches, prior converted crop land, and farm and stock watering ponds.

Walker and Maj. Gen. Diana Holland, commander of the South Atlantic Division of the Corps, joined Agriculture Commissioner Gary W. Black and Attorney General Chris Carr in announcing the finalization of the new definition at the headquarters of the Georgia Department of Agriculture in

"Navigable waters" were first declared waters of the United States subject to EPA and Army Corps jurisdiction by the Clean Water Act of 1972.

"For decades there have been multiple definitions and regulatory interpretations of waters of the U.S. and litigation surrounding this key term in the law has been near constant," Walker said. "Over time (presidential) administrations have expanded the reach of the WOTUS definition, moving from regulating a waterway where a commercial vessel can navigate to channels that flow only when it rains and isolated wetlands."

A 2015 revision to the definition prompted Attorney General Carr to lead a multi-state coalition in blocking enforcement of the rule, which he called "an example of federal overreach" into states' authority.

Carr expressed gratitude to the federal government for "promulgating a rule that is based on common sense, that will protect our natural resources and also understand that the state has a role in protecting those natural resources and making sure that we can protect the agricultural interests and the private property interests as well."

Will Bentley, president of the Georgia Agribusiness Council and a working cattleman in Thomaston, said the new rule will make it easier for Georgia's farmers to work on their farms without having to ask federal permission first.

"It provides clarity to us as far as figuring out what we can do in our pastures and what we can do to take care of our grasses and our crops," he said. "You don't have to have a lawyer to figure it out."

Commissioner Black said agricultural producers look for certainty and reasonable regulation, and the new definition of navigable waters provides that.

"The central message you heard today is that everyone's been seeking clarity, certainty, a step-by-step approach to being reasonable and that's what we've achieved through this rule," he said.

The Navigable Waters Protection Rule will become effective 60 days after publication in the *Federal Register*.

Technology helps the green industry thrive in a tight labor market

DULUTH – A tight job market for landscaping businesses in Georgia offered vendors at the annual WinterGreen trade show a chance

to show off products that bring technology to a labor-intensive industry.

Landscapers, lawn services and nurseries, like other businesses, are looking for ways to maximize their labor resources as Georgia experiences record low employment levels. Vendors at WinterGreen, the annual trade show of the Georgia Green Industry Association, said they see the tight labor market as an opportunity for new technology.

"The main thing and whole reason why we are so successful in this is the labor shortages. That's all we hear. Every single customer, 'We can't find help, we can't find help," said Robert Mudrak of My Goat, a Nashville, Tenn., based company that designs and builds robotic grass mowers.

Stationed at one corner of the trade show held last month in the Infinite Energy Center, My Goat got the attention of passersby with a demo model built for small areas. The smaller model resembles an indoor robotic vacuum sweeper.

"So far, most people have been using them to fill in the work in – for lack of a better term – common areas," Mudrak said. "Golf courses will put their employees on the golf course, and they'll put these on the common areas."

He said his company works with mower manufacturers to build different sizes of mowers to fit a customer's need. That could be large fields or roadside rights of way.

"Some of the mowers are so big, they look

like they come from a science fiction movie," he said.

The makers of the TreeDiaper took the existing technology of baby diapers and turned it into a rechargeable watering device for trees and shrubs. Dan Whitehead, the Georgia sales rep for the company, said the TreeDiaper helps by reducing the labor needed to care for the tree while also providing proper mainte-See **TECHNOLOGY**, page **6**



My TRACTOR STORY: A machine with a past



Raybon Anderson loves agriculture and antique farm equipment. He has an antique tractor collection that includes a John Deere LA like the one his daddy used. Anderson bought the tiny tractor at a classic tractor auction in Waynesboro a couple of years ago.

Although the LA produced only 11 horsepower, that's still 10 more horsepower than the mules that farmers were replacing during World War II. The LA had a lot of uses on the farm, mostly planting and plowing tobacco.

Another tractor Anderson has gotten a lot of use out of is a 1953 Ford Jubilee that he's had since 1980. He also has a 1952 Farmall Super M and a 1971 Farmall 140. nance with a consistent flow of water.

"We hear quite a bit that manpower is at a premium, and people are concerned," he said. "What we do is not only help in lowering the number of times needed to water a tree but also improve on the proper care for that tree. You only plant a tree once, but you have to water several times for it to be successful."

The product is made of landscaping tarp material shaped to wrap around the base of plants. Inside the tarp are packs of hydrogel pellets like the ones used in baby diapers that hold and then slowly release water.


Whitehead said the TreeDiaper can hold up to a month's worth of water. It can also replenish itself with rainfall and lasts for five years.

The Atlanta-based makers of Swift Straw offer plastic-wrapped bales of pine straw. Grant Feehrer said his company provides a new spin on an old product by compressing pine straw in different packaging from traditional bales held together by twine.

"It's more efficient for (landscapers). The workers can move more at one time," Feehrer said. "The big benefit of having plastic-wrapped instead of a string-tied bale is that it won't bust in a million piec-

The company found that landscape workers spend a lot of time and effort physically moving pine straw – to the site, to the work area, spreading out the material and then cleaning up. Repackaging and compacting the pine straw was one way to make the job more efficient, Feehrer said. The plastic-wrapped bales are the same size as twine-tied bales but hold about 1.5 times the amount of pine straw.

"It cuts the time on unloading because the bales are palletized so that they can unload an entire truck in about thirty to forty-five minutes as opposed to a couple of hours unloading two string-tied square bales at a time."



FORESTRY MATTERS: The best of the best

What do you like best about your job? At the Georgia Forestry Commission, most employees react to that question with replies centering on the opportunity to work with landowners, be in the great outdoors, or answer their call to serve. Those qualities fuel the agency's mission to provide leadership, service and education in the protection and conservation of Georgia's forest resources, and GFC's 569-person (full time) work force is living proof.

Every year, the commission honors its "best of the best" with awards for outstanding achievements in reaching goals that support our mission. The organization covers every square inch of Georgia, and its employees serve through designated regions and zones that make it possible to quickly reach landowners in any location.

The GFC's Forest Management group works to ensure Georgia's 24.6-million acres of forestland remains healthy and intact. That means providing private landowners with a wide variety of services that support a productive and sustainable forest landscape.

Of GFC Forest Management's five regions, the 2019 Region of the Year is Region 2, which encompasses 36 counties in the northeastern part of Georgia. The winner is determined annually by the impact it has on the state - and even the nation - by considering all factors foresters participate in year-round to assist landowners. This includes general advice, cost share, stewardship, water quality, protection work (both fire and forest health) and community outreach efforts.

Forest Management Region 2's numerous achievements impacted 113,000 acres, including 131 outreach events, southern pine beetle and emerald ash borer trapping, and numerous training, wildfire prevention and disaster assistance events such as Hurricane Michael recovery support in Southwest Georgia.



The GFC's Protection group is responsible for all wildfire protection across the state. Recipients of the 2019 awards were selected based on the evaluation of established criteria that considered equipment readiness, wildfire response, customer services and safety. Awards were given for North and South Zones and Area of the

Chattahoochee/Marion was named the North Zone County Unit of the Year. Among its many noteworthy achievements in protecting close to 223,000 forested acres, per-

sonnel were recognized for assisting an average of 24 landowners per employee, achieving an equipment inspection score of 98.75 and helping remodel the GFC Chattahoochee office.

The GFC Baker/Mitchell Unit was chosen as the South Zone County Unit of the Year. Unit employees tackled extraordinary circumstances in the wake of 2018's Hurricane Michael, including restoration programs in conjunction with the National Guard, city and county agencies.

They helped clear 250 miles of debris on area public roads and completed 130 restoration applications and 1,232 miles of debris clearing. They also read a whopping 1,141 agriculture water meters, a service provided by GFC for the Georgia Environmental Protection Division.

The GFC 2019 Area of the Year, which encompasses all units and zones, is Area 4, which covers 2,169,539 forested acres in Central Georgia. In addition to completing close to 2,000 hours of training, employees assisted 620 landowners with prescribed burning, plowing and harrowing, suppressed 141 wildfires on 463,000 acres, and assisted with Hurricane Michael relief and GFC seed collection and cone shed activities

The 2019 GFC award winners are scheduled to be recognized on the floor of the Georgia Legislature this month.

COOK GEORGIA GROWN: Cajun Sweet Potato Salad

Editor's Note: While sweet potato season in Georgia is August to November, February is Sweet Potato Month nationwide. Sweet potatoes are a warm-weather vegetable that require a long growing season. They are grown from "slips," which are plants produced from the roots of previous crops. Potatoes are ready to harvest 90-120 days after planting. Here's one of our favorite new twists on sweet potato bliss.

Ingredients:

- 5 cups cubed and roasted sweet
- potatoes 34 cup chopped celery
- 1/2 cup chopped red peppers
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions
- 1/4 cup chopped red onions
- 1/2 cup sweet pickle relish
- 1 each minced and seeded fresh jalapeno

Directions:

1 tsp creole seasoning 1 tsp onion powder 1 tsp blackening seasoning 34 cup local honey 3 Tbsps yellow mustard

1/4 cup apple cider vinegar Salt & pepper

In a large bowl, combine sweet potatoes, celery, red peppers, green onions, red onions, pickle relish and jalapeno.

In a small bowl combine all seasonings, honey, mustard and apple cider vinegar. Whisk together until blended.

Pour dressing over sweet potato mixture and toss. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Serve chilled or at room temperature. For an added treat add crumbled bacon!





Going bananas One gardener's attempt to cultivate the tropics in North Georgia

HARTWELL - The United States is one of the top consumers of bananas. Most of the ones we eat are imported from countries in Central America such as Panama, Costa Rica or Ecuador; however, a portion of what we consume is grown in the U.S. – specifically Hawaii – as bananas prefer high-heat climates. Few to none are harvested in the Southeast region of the United States, but what if you could have a few shoots of bananas growing out of your own backyard?

Years ago, Kim Higginbotham was at the hair salon when she noticed a container of tropical plants outside of the entry way. Upon inquiring about the plants, she learned that they were divided banana plants. Other than that, her stylist had no clue what to do with them and decided to give her one.

"I'll try to grow anything," said Higginbotham, but little did she know that she'd need to keep her steadfast optimism for a while longer than anticipated.

After two years in a pot, the plants showed zero signs of growth. The third year Higginbotham decided to plant them in the ground, and four miniscule bananas sprouted within that same year. In the fourth and fifth years, she decided to go back to housing them in pots for easier maneuvering during winter.

In the fifth year of having the plants, she chose to upsize the pots, which produced a huge growth spurt in the plants. In 2017, the sixth year, she gave a few away but planted the rest in the ground.

After six years of nurturing these unpredictable plants, they'd grown to nearly 10 feet tall. At this point it was winter,

so she followed her usual plan of dividing out the small bananas and putting everything in the garage. Seeing that she yielded a greater harvest from planting in the ground rather than pots, Higginbotham planted 12 in the ground and was able to sell 11 of them. Out of what she sold, she received reports that two that didn't make it. Both were cases of the plants being eaten by animals – one by a goat, the other by a dog.

It is now 2020, and the plants have been cut down and mulched for winter. The bananas typically produce July through October, and Higginbotham predicts that they should begin sprouting once the last frost has passed.

Fifteen of the shoots from the last harvest were donated to the Elbert County High School's FFA greenhouse this past fall instead of being sold per usual. Depending on the intended purpose of the nurturer(s), all those shoots could potentially make up to four plants each.

Jordan Collins, the agriculture adviser at Elbert County High, reported that the donated plants are doing well and are currently dormant in the school's greenhouse. The plants are about two feet tall and have already started sprouting shoots. Collins said the ultimate goal is to help the plants continue to grow and eventually be able to sell the fruits of the class's labor at the school's annual spring plant sale within the next three years.

With the recent buzz on the topic of home-grown food, how does growing your own bananas "a peel" to you?
