### CDC: Take care when handling backyard poultry flocks

Salmonella contracted from backyard poultry has sickened at least 163 people in 43 states – including nine in Georgia – prompting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to issue reminders about safe handling of backyard flocks.

Salmonella bacteria live in the intestines of people and animals. According to the CDC, people get salmonella infections by eating contaminated food or drinking contaminated water, or by touching infected animals, their feces, or their environment.

Most people infected with Salmonella experience diarrhea, fever, and stomach cramps that begin six hours to six days after infection and last four to seven days. Most people recover without medical attention, but the elderly and young children are susceptible to more severe illness.

To avoid infection through backyard poultry flocks, the CDC recommends that you:

- **Wash your hands**
  - o Always wash your hands with soap and water immediately after touching backyard poultry, their eggs, or anything in the area where they live and roam.
  - o Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not readily available. Consider having hand sanitizer at your coop.
- **Be safe around backyard flocks**
  - o Don't kiss or snuggle backyard poul-

- try, and don't eat or drink around them. This can spread Salmonella germs to your mouth and make you sick.
- o Keep your backyard flock and supplies you use to care for them (like feed containers and shoes you wear in the coop) outside of the house. You should

also clean the supplies outside the house.

- **Supervise kids around flocks**
  - o Always supervise children around backyard poultry and make sure they wash their hands properly afterward.
  - o Don't let children younger than 5 years

touch chicks, ducklings, or other backyard poultry. Young children are more likely to get sick from germs like Salmonella.

- **Handle eggs safely**
  - o Collect eggs often. Eggs that sit in the nest can become dirty or break.
  - o Throw away cracked eggs. Germs on the shell can more easily enter the egg through a cracked shell.
  - o Rub off dirt on eggs with fine sandpaper, a brush, or a cloth. Don't wash them because colder water can pull germs into the egg.
  - o Refrigerate eggs to keep them fresh and slow the growth of germs.
  - o Cook eggs until both the yolk and white are firm and cook egg dishes to an internal temperature of 160°F to kill all germs.

Call your healthcare provider right away if you have any of these severe symptoms:

- Diarrhea and a fever higher than 102°F.
- Diarrhea for more than three days that is not improving.
- Bloody diarrhea.
- So much vomiting that you cannot keep liquids down.
- Signs of dehydration, such as:
  - o Not urinating much.
  - o Dry mouth and throat.
  - o Feeling dizzy when standing up.

### Black farmers are focus of online photo exhibit

*Federation of Southern Cooperatives looks back in time to raise awareness*

The old saying goes, "A picture is worth a thousand words."

The Federation of Southern Cooperatives and Land Assistance Fund is proving that point in an online photo exhibit that showcases the lives of black farmers 50 years ago and tells their stories as food providers and keepers of the land.

Titled "Bridging Art and Farming: Celebrating Black Family Farmers, Landowners and Cooperatives," the exhibit offers a glimpse at the lives of black farmers in Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi in the late 1960s through the early 1980s.

The exhibit is online but was initially planned last year as an in-person experience at the Carter Center in Atlanta. The event was postponed due to the COVID pandemic.

Donna DeCallie, FSC/LAF communications and member relations director, said most of the photos are being seen for the first time in public. The photos were assembled shortly after the federation's founding in 1966 as part of a project to document the lives of black farmers.

"When I came to the federation and saw the multitude of photos that we had spanning over 50 years, I realized that a lot of people hadn't seen those photos," DeCallie said. "I thought it was a great idea for folks to really kind of see some of those historical photos of black farmers, cooperatives and landowners."

The exhibit has three sections: Resil-

ient Farm Families by Reesa Tansey; Land, Land, Land by Larry Herman; and Cooperative Economic Power by Pat Goudvis. The photos show farmers working the fields, families gathering on their front porches,

and workers in cooperative industries.

The photos are of a world nearly forgotten over time. Goudvis was a college student from California who spent the summer of

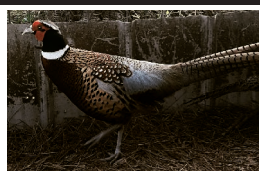

## FORESTRY MATTERS: Be on the lookout for signs of southern pine beetle infestation

Keeping Georgia's forests healthy, productive, and sustainable is a year 'round job with a lot of seasonal activities. One of those is an annual assessment of projected pest activity which can have devastating and expensive effects on timberland.

Southern pine beetles have killed more than \$254 million worth of pine trees in Georgia since 1972. Based on more than 35 years of survey data, outbreaks of the insect tend to be cyclic and often correspond with weather events like drought or flooding, depending on the location within Georgia. Stand conditions such as overcrowding, old age or root disease can invite pine beetle infestations as well. Lightning-struck trees are particularly vulnerable to attack, as are trees damaged by road building or logging activities.

Pine beetles are more active in the summer, which is why the Georgia Forestry Commission participates annually in the U.S. Forest Service's Southern Pine Beetle Prediction Trapping Program. This program allows the commission to predict pine beetle population levels and assist landowners with management decisions, such as when to thin or harvest.

This year, foresters hung 51 traps across the state, and collections were made for six weeks. An average of 9.9 southern pine beetles was captured per trap, per day. This number is considered low.

The county with the highest probability of an outbreak was Carroll County, at 21 percent chance of an outbreak. Heard, Morgan and Oconee counties follow with an 11 percent chance of an outbreak. Remaining counties have less than a five percent chance of an outbreak. An outbreak is considered more than 50 southern pine beetle spots per county.

Owners of pine trees should regularly assess their trees for signs of southern pine beetle. They include green needles on the ground, boring dust, pitch tubes and galleries under the bark. One of the clues is resin that oozes out of the tree around a beetle entrance hole on the bark. These pitch tubes are the tree's defense mechanism against the beetles, with resin pushing the beetle out.

As the No. 1 forestry state in the nation, Georgia also leads in the availability of forest biomass. Biomass is plant matter that can be converted to an energy source. It includes agricultural materials, tree residue from managed forests, and wood waste from urban areas.

A new statewide forest biomass assessment shows that approximately 17.1 million dry tons per year of biomass is potentially available for use in Georgia. The top three sources of forest biomass are: timber growth – 8,127,664 dry tons (48 percent of total); urban wood waste – 2,425,084 dry tons (14 percent of total); non-merchantable biomass from final harvests – 2,249,223 dry tons (13 percent of total). Interestingly, Georgia has the second greatest

urban wood waste potential in the U.S.; with an annual value of \$7 million to \$53 million, depending on the products derived from the waste wood.

## GEORGIA COOKING: Lemonade two ways

### Blueberry lemonade

Yields 1 drink



**Ingredients**  
2oz blueberries  
3oz lemonade

**Directions**  
Gently press blueberries to release juice. Add lemonade and ice cubes to glass. Gently mix items together. Garnish with blueberries and lemon wedge.

### Watermelon lemonade

Makes 1 quart of lemonade, 3-4 servings



**Ingredients**  
3 cups diced watermelon, in half-inch pieces  
½ cup fresh-squeezed lemon juice, from 3-4 lemons  
¼ cup sugar  
¼ cup water  
1 cup ice cubes

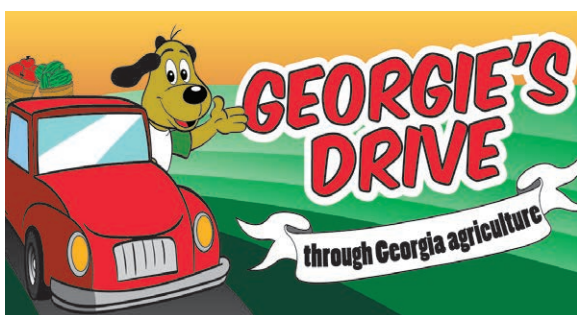
**Directions**  
Place watermelon in a blender and puree until smooth. Let puree

settle for about 5 minutes until the pulp rises to the top and the clearer juice remains at the bottom. Pour through a fine-mesh strainer, and rub with a spoon to extract juice from the pulp, leaving about 2 teaspoons of pulp behind.

Place ¼ cup sugar and ¼ cup water in a saucepan and bring to a boil, stirring to dissolve sugar. When sugar is completely dissolved, turn off the heat. Add sugar syrup, lemon juice, and 1 cup ice to strained watermelon puree, and stir to melt ice. Taste and check for the balance of lemons juice to sugar, and adjust if necessary.

For minty watermelon lemonade, rub 2 sprigs of mint in between your palms until bruised and very fragrant. Add to lemonade.

Serve over ice with lemon slices and watermelon triangles.



## Georgie's Drive Thru Fort Mudge

Hello! I'm Georgie, the Georgia Grown mascot. I travel the state of Georgia promoting our No. 1 industry, agriculture! "We have met the enemy and he is

us!" is a quote by Pogo the Possum, one of the most popular comic strips of all time. Set in the Okefenokee Swamp around Waycross and Fort Mudge, Pogo was the creation of Walt Kelly, who came up with the idea of a comic strip featuring swamp animals, including Pogo the Possum and Albert the Alligator, while visiting the area in 1942. Looking at the illustrations and reading the dialog, it's hard to believe he was not from Georgia and didn't live here while creating the adventures of his famous possum. Pogo found huge popularity in the 1950s blending political and social satire with the backdrop of the famous South Georgia swamp. Walt Kelly created and produced the cartoon from the late 1940s until his death in 1973. It was then carried on for a short time after his death by his children and then made a comeback in the late 1980s. The only trace left in Waycross of Pogo the Possum is the huge painting of him on a water tank that welcomes visitors to town on U.S Highway 84.

# MARKET WATCH: Local Farmbag seeks to connect farmers with community

For Local Farmbag, a produce home delivery service based out of the Savannah State Farmers Market, it is all about connecting the community with good food.

The company connects local farmers with customers by delivering seasonal agricultural products as close to farm to fork as one can get. Their pitch, called The Farmbag Way, is “Get to know us, choose your bag, Enjoy local!”

Their story began in 2009 when a small farmers market in Savannah’s historic district closed. Howard and his partner operated a restaurant and were also organizers of the market.

Howard said they thought the market was a great way to connect with people and wanted to keep it going somehow.

“When that shut down, we knew all the farmers, so we just said, ‘Hey, why don’t we try to deliver it?’” Howard said. “We threw out an email and had 30 deliveries that first week, and it grew to about 150 deliveries pretty quick after that. It just kind of morphed into the current business we have.”

Local Farmbag customers sign up to get a produce bag delivered weekly or every other week in Savannah and surrounding areas. The bags come in four sizes starting with a mini size with four items. Other sizes are small at 8-11 lbs. of local produce; medium, with homemade bread at 14-17 lbs.; large bag at 20-25 lbs. Customers can customize their bags to avoid allergens or, as the website puts it, “Have an irrational fear of some weird-looking vegetable? We will leave it out.”

“The produce bag and program are really based on whatever is in season,” How-

ard said. “Right now, in this week’s bag, we have blueberries coming in from Georgia, peaches coming in from South Carolina, and some melons coming in from Florida. Also, squash, zucchini and tomatoes are just starting to come out.”

Local Farmbag also recently started providing add-ons to their bags for beef and pork products from Hunter Cattle Company in Brooklet and Savannah River Farms in Sylvania. They also offer locally made cheese, pasta and sauces and various cooking oils.

Howard explained they have worked to build a network of local farmers, although they do work with some large food distributors to maintain a good variety of produce.

“Ideally, if I can get everything within a 50-mile radius, that would be fantastic, but in truth, that’s just not realistic,” he said.

The company is always seeking ways to deliver more variety of produce. Howard explained Savannah is in a unique location for agriculture and that many different things

can be grown, though not on a large scale, so the network of small farms is an essential part of the service.

“When I first started working with them, they would have the typical turnips collards one time a year, and then they would have a squash and zucchini the other time of year, and watermelons and things of that nature,” Howard said. “But working with them, I’ve got them to grow 20 or 30 different varieties where we can include them in the bag every week and really stretch their season and the amount of produce we purchase from them.”

After a few years of working out of their restaurant, Local Farmbag moved into a 475-square-foot warehouse at the Savannah State Farmers Market, where produce boxes are assembled and shipped to customers’

doorsteps each week.

“It’s pretty small and fortunately, Rita (Davis, market manager) was nice enough to allow us to take over the market’s conference room when we got busier with the COVID thing, which really helped us out,” Howard said. “We still operate out of that little warehouse. We’ve just become a lot more efficient.”

And in a similar way of connecting with customers and farmers, Local Farmbag has always sought to connect with the community further. They donate to local food banks and homeless shelters regularly and on Saturdays give away produce bags to those in need.

Howard calls the effort their “dinged box program,” where blemished produce that doesn’t meet the delivery standard is available for donations.

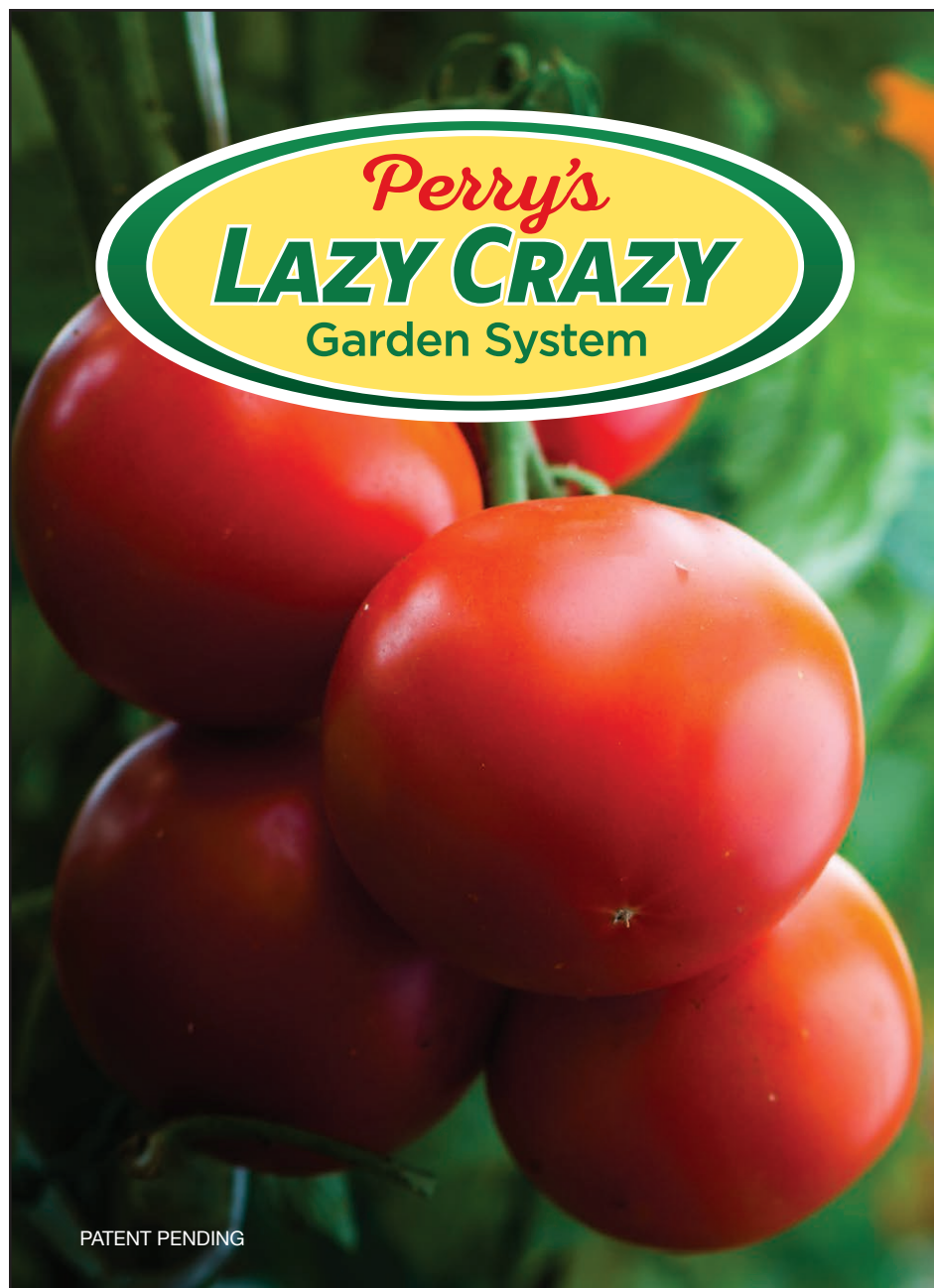
“It’s just cosmetically flawed, and we don’t give anyone anything that we wouldn’t eat ourselves,” he said.

Local Farmbag also offers the dinged boxes for sale at a discount at the Farmers Market every Saturday from their warehouse. Davis said Local Farmbag has been a big supporter of the Farmers Market in bringing customers in and attracting local farmers.

“I love being at the market, and we’re doing our best to really promote and try and get this market back to where it should be, as far as busy on the weekends and so forth,” Howard said.

1974 traveling across the South taking photos for the FSC/LAF. She explained it was quite a culture shock for her.

Goudvis, who is white, was 21 years old and traveling by herself through the South for the first time. She said the openness of people she met was striking.

“People were incredibly friendly and welcoming,” she said.

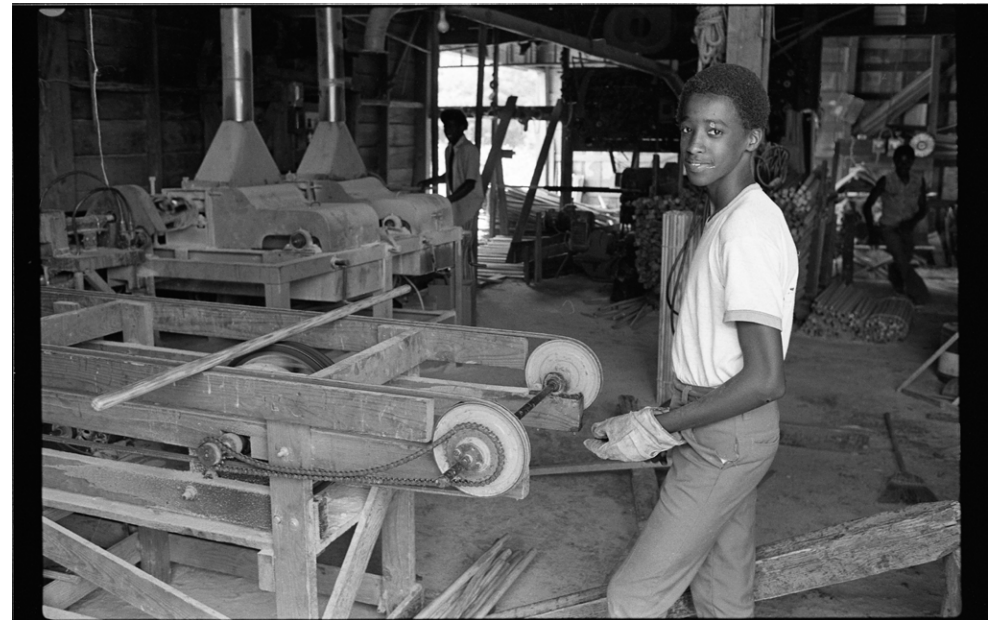
Goudvis also recalled seeing poverty every place she went, and the difficulties black farmers faced. A challenge for her then was how to tell their story with film in a respectful way.

very deep privilege.”

Goudvis took thousands of photos across several states, from a pulpwood operation to farm families and cooperatives.

One such place was the Greene-Hale Sewing Cooperative of Greenville, Ala. The sewing cooperative employed 50 women and had contracts with the national retailer JC Penney to sew undergarments in the early 1970s. The cooperative closed when apparel jobs moved overseas.

However, other cooperatives are still here, such as the West Georgia Farmers' Cooperative in Harris County, one of the first co-

“It was quite an amazing trip for me, for somebody from a different part of the country, and I was a little bit young for much of the civil rights movement,” Goudvis said, “and I think that is what motivates people who go into documentary photography or filmmaking. It is sort of a ticket to go places and meet people and be in situations that otherwise you just would not be able to. The camera opens that door, and I think that is a

operatives formed by black farmers through the FSC/LAF.

Larry Herman, who photographed the cooperative members, noted that places like the West Georgia cooperative seem like a faraway land now as the number of black farms has dwindled since then.

“I photographed them in their environment and how they were organized to defend a culture under profound economic and so-

cial pressure,” Herman said.

DeCallie explained the photos offer a glimpse of the past while also helping the future of black farms by highlighting the challenges of segregation and economic disadvantages. She said they hope to organize the photos to promote awareness in preserving farmland and helping black farmers keep their land.

According to the federation, the number of farms owned by African Americans in the United States decreased from 925,000 to 18,616 between 1920 to 1992. That drop has stabilized in recent years, but according to the 2017 Census of Agriculture by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, there were 35,470 black-owned farms in the United States or less than 1 percent of all farms.

## Georgia 4-H celebrates winners of its double-elimination State 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl

On May 13, 40 youth participated in the virtual 2021 Georgia 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl supported by The Georgia Dairy Youth Foundation and Milk Check-Off.

Youth participating in the quiz bowl receive a better knowledge of dairy-related topics and learn to demonstrate that knowledge in a competitive and thought-stimulating environment and gain important life skills, such as confidence, independence and compassion. They also strengthen decision-making and leadership skills in an environment which allows contribution to a group effort, encouraging teamwork and collaboration with a diverse group of peers.

“Every year that I work with this contest, I’m astounded by the depth and breadth of knowledge of our young people in the state,” said Jillian Bohlen, University of Georgia Cooperative Extension dairy science specialist. “The youth this year came to the contest not

only with understanding of the dairy industry but with enthusiasm for the competition. A hard-fought double elimination event, they thought, collaborated, buzzed, laughed and made a great 2021 State Dairy Quiz Bowl competition. Congratulations to all competitors as you should all be incredibly proud.”

Two divisions of teams compete during the quiz bowl, junior and senior, and each county was permitted to enter two teams in each division. If a team contained more than four members, the top three individual scores were used to establish the team score.

Senior competitors were given one attempt to complete a 100-question multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank test in a limited time frame to gauge their knowledge of dairy nutrition, calf management, parlor management and reproduction, as well as current events and statistics within the dairy industry.

A team plaque will be presented to the first place junior and senior teams. The winning senior team will also represent Georgia at the North American Invitational 4-H Dairy Quiz

Bowl Contest in November in Louisville, Kentucky.

# She shears sheep

## Georgia women find a niche market in the animal fiber field

Rosemarie Szostak said she enjoys shearing sheep and achieves a near Zen-like frame of mind while doing her job. It is like meditation for her.

“I just kind of get into a zone and I’m just doing the shearing,” she said. “People ask me how do I keep track of the sheep? I say that it is the job of the shepherd to tell me how many sheep I’ve sheared. If I start counting, I’ll fall asleep.”

Sheep shearers like Szostak log many miles and shear many sheep each spring in Georgia and surrounding states. Alpacas, llamas, and long-haired goats also require annual shearing.

Shearing is a required job for anyone who raises sheep or other fiber-producing animals, but a lot of the work is contracted out to individuals like Szostak.

Nicole Taylor, a shearer from Cleveland, said more people are getting into sheep, creating a demand for her services. The trend she sees is that small homesteads are getting sheep as an inexpensive way to keep livestock.

“Generally, the fiber sheep and goats tend to be easily managed. You’re not dealing with 2,500-pound steers,” Taylor said. “It’s a nice way for somebody who only has a couple of acres to dabble in farming without having to make a huge investment or having a lot of additional work. Most homesteaders have another job, so it’s not their only thing.”

Most sheep flocks in Georgia are raised for meat rather than fiber.

“It’s more of a cottage industry,” Taylor said about animal fiber, but it is catching on.

### Spring is for shearing

Jessica Jarvholm at Pineywoods Farm in LaGrange has nine sheep and two alpacas. She is starting her herd to make fiber a part of her farm operations.

Pineywoods Farm grows organic fruit and vegetables and plans to move into agritourism with a learning center on animal fiber cultivation and production.

“I think that’s going to be an important part of our mission here to show the connectivity from fleece to whatever product you want,” Jarvholm said. “It will be another great place for people to come anywhere along that process, whether you want to come see the shearer shear, or you are interested in processing, dyeing, or knitting. You can come, and you can be a part of the whole process or just come in at one area that you have an interest in and learn a new hobby.”

In the South, spring shearing starts in February with herds in Florida. Szostak said she and others will then work their way up as the weather warms up. Business picks up in Georgia in March and goes to Memorial Day.

Szostak and Taylor said they are booked solid with clients, and both said they love doing it.

Szostak has a doctorate in chemistry and moved to Georgia from Chicago in the 1980s for a faculty position at the Georgia Institute of Technology. She bought Oak Hill Farm in Newton County. A knitter since the age of 12, she had a plan.

“I thought, ‘Wouldn’t it be cool to make a sweater from scratch?’ so I bought a flock of sheep,” she said. “I learned how to spin, and the only thing I didn’t do was shear sheep. I thought, ‘Well, you know what?’ I really wanted to complete the circle.”

### Necessity leads to invention

She took a weekend class on sheep shearing at the University of Georgia, sponsored by the Georgia Sheep and Wool Growers Association. Once she learned how to shear, Szostak said she had friends who asked her to shear their sheep.

“Then somebody else heard about it, and that is how the business started,” she said.

Szostak also does several shearing demonstrations throughout the year at Zoo Atlanta, Stone Mountain Park, the Birmingham Zoo, and the North Georgia Wildlife Park in Cleveland. She even met her husband at a sheep shearing demo at a festival in Sandy Springs. He happened to be the curator at the Georgia Agriculture Museum in Tifton.

“The young lady who normally helped me was sick, and I needed somebody to help bring the sheep out and help flip them over and that sort of thing,” Szostak said. “She tried to play matchmaker and set me up with the guy who does sheep shearing demonstrations using hand shears. He helped me, then we started dating, and then we got married.”

Taylor also owns alpaca and sheep at her farm and offers services to process the fleece

through her business, Spirit Fiber Works. She moved to Georgia from Florida after retiring from teaching and started an alpaca farm. She, too, paid a shearer to shear her flock, then realized she could probably do it herself.

“I hosted a shearing school at my farm, where a bunch of alpaca farmers got together, and we hired someone to come in and teach us how to shear, so I started shearing my own,” Taylor said. “And then when I got sheep, I kind of just self-taught myself how

to do the sheep.”

She saw the opportunity to start a spinning business when asking clients what they would do with the fleece she had just sheared for them. With few spinners around, many said they didn’t know.

“I’m a teacher at heart, so what I do is more from an educational perspective,” Taylor said. “When I come to shear an animal, I don’t just get the fiber off and throw it in a bag and leave. We talk about the health of the animal. We discuss what the quality of the fiber is and what their options are. It’s more of a teaching opportunity. If they choose to send their fiber to me to process, they have the option of coming and participating in the processing of the fiber at our farm.”

Szostak says there is more than one way to shear a sheep. She explained that almost everyone learns the traditional Australian method to fleece a sheep and then adapts. A small-statured woman, Szostak shears hundreds of sheep each year and knows what it’s like to wrestle with an animal that can weigh a couple of hundred pounds.

“I do what I call the G method, which is the girl-type method of shearing sheep. These Australian shearers, I mean, they end up with bad backs,” Szostak said. “They are using their brawn, so I thought, ‘I’m going to use my brains.’ I developed a method that is pretty similar, but it is less stressful on my back.”

### Working smarter, not harder

The Australian method is when the shearer sits the sheep upright on its rear and shears down from the back, front, neck, and legs, with the shearer bending down and maneuvering the sheep through the shearing. Taylor improvised a different method to save her back.

“What we do is we lay them down on a gymnastics mat, which the sheep usually fall asleep because they think it’s great, and then I shear them that way,” Taylor said. “And that’s especially helpful for ewes that are about to deliver lambs because we can be very gentle and careful.”

Taylor shears alpacas, which requires the animals to lie down with their front and hind legs tied by a rope. Taylor said the method is done to prevent injury to both the shearer and animal.

Service with kindness is a key to being a successful shearer.

“If you’re not a humane shearer, meaning if you cut up the sheep or you treat it rough, the shepherd is not going to call you back,” Szostak said.

Taylor said there is a connection people have with their sheep.

“I shear for people that if I don’t give their sheep a kiss every time I let it up off the mat, their hearts are broken,” Taylor said. “I mean, they are really family members, a lot of them, so they need to be treated as such. It’s a different client base.”

# Giving beetles the boot

## GDA Structural Pest Inspectors learn on the job and save history in the process

**BARTOW COUNTY** – Inspectors employed by the Structural Pest Division of the Georgia Department of Agriculture recently learned by doing and helped preserve a piece of Georgia history in the process.

Bob and Mary Norton, fifth generation owners of Valley View Farm, hosted a two-day training session for newly hired inspectors May 17 and 18. The training covered safety and other issues unique to the job and offered a hands-on lesson in the professional treatment of invasive wood pests that can damage and weaken structures and furnishings.

The Structural Pest Division does not engage in pest treatment as a rule, but it does license and regulate pest control companies operating in Georgia. State inspectors are tasked with responding to consumer complaints involving the pest industry.

Structural Pest Director Derrick Lastinger said the training offered the new inspectors valuable insight into the workings of the industry they regulate.

“We do these once or twice a year,” Lastinger said. “I think they’re great for learning and for team-building.”

Unlike other divisions of GDA, Structural Pest works face-to-face with consumers throughout the state, and they are doing it with a smaller and younger work force, Lastinger said.

The section’s inspection staff has shrunk from 24 to 12 due to budget cuts through the years, but recent hiring has filled every inspector position, including those left open by the retirement of seasoned personnel. Carl Schnabel, a structural pest inspector who previously worked in the private sector, led the training that saw the inspectors treating affected crawlspaces and wood furniture with Bora-Care.

Dr. Reid Ipser, director of technical services for manufacturer Nisus Corp., said the product has been on the market since the 1980s and is used to treat a variety of household pests – including termites and carpenter ants – as well as wood rot. Since 1990 the product has been used as a preventative treatment in all new home construction.

Nisus donated nearly \$1,000 worth of Bora-Care to the project for remedial treatment at Valley View, a 10-room house built in the 1840s. The structure, which has remained in the same family for five generations, was occupied by Union troops during the Civil War. Today it is host to powder post beetles.

Dr. Dan Suiter, extension entomologist on the Griffin Campus of the University of Georgia, said wood-boring beetles are attracted to dead wood and often enter crawlspaces through vents to feast on floor

joists. The beetles eat holes in the wood where they deposit their eggs. Subsequent generations live their life cycles – eggs, larvae, juveniles, adults – inside the wood and emerge on two-year cycles to mate and die. Emergence in Georgia typically occurs in late spring.

Each room of the farmhouse at Valley View has its own crawlspace, and inspectors sprayed all of them – as well as antique furniture – with Bora-Care to prevent future infestations. Clothed in Tyvek suits, gloves, respirators and goggles, the inspectors maneuvered through trapdoors cut in the wood floors of the house armed with whisk brooms to brush away the cobwebs. They used gallon sprayers and paint rollers to coat the sills and joists with product.

The owners of Valley View sought GDA’s assistance with the beetles back in 2006. On the advice of a specialist at the University of Georgia, the homeowners installed French drains to carry moisture away from the house, but the beetles persisted.

According to Valley View owner Bob Norton, the materials used to build Valley View were organic to the farm. The bricks were baked in the front pasture, the limestone used in the mortar was dug on the farm, and the wood was harvested from trees on site.

“These bricks, having been made on the property, they’re like a clay pot. When it rains they absorb the moisture so the crawl spaces tend to stay wet,” said Nancy Collier, a supervisor in the Structural Pest Division who has worked with Turner for several years to get a handle on the beetle problem.

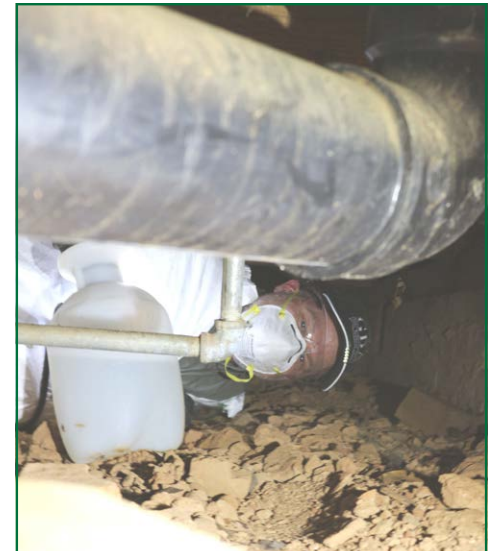
When it became apparent that treatment would be necessary, Collier – who also serves as coordinator of outreach and special projects – saw an opportunity to do good beyond training the next generation of inspectors.

“This is a historic structure in Bartow County and we’re glad to be able to help,” she said.

Valley View has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1974.
